## Britain to recruit thousands of foreign doctors:

In this issue we have some good news for our brothers and sisters in Medical profession. The news indicates a good opportunity for going abroad and also being in the same profession. Although as of now, we don't have any specific web sites to give more information about this but we believe that the local Great Britain embassy should be able to tell you all and every information about the process and procedures to be followed for this. So you may be required to strive a little harder to gather this more specific information but still its worth a try and efforts. This news article can be your base point to start with. Here the news goes...

Britain plans to recruit thousands of foreign senior doctors, including those from India, to meet the shortage of general practitioners (GPs) and fulfil election pledges by the Labor Party to provide 10,000 new doctors in the next four years.

Britain is facing a serious shortage of GPs, partly because thousands of Indian-trained doctors who were recruited in the 1970s are now beginning to retire.

The Times daily today reported that the British government would launch a global advertising campaign next month to meet the requirements.

It said that Health Secretary Alan Milburn was appealing to doctors in Asia, Australia, Canada, Europe and the United States for the purpose.

According to official sources, the government is being forced to recruit doctors from overseas, particularly from Spain, Germany and Italy, after realizing that it would be unable to meet the election promises on public services.

The government promised in its National Health Service (NHS) Plan last summer to employ 7,500 more consultants and 2,000 GPs by the end of 2004. But latest figures show that the number of new doctors who registered last year was the lowest for eight years. Just 8,703 new doctors from home and abroad registered to work in the UK last year - the lowest since 1992.

## Written Test Question Paper:

The following paper is just a sample Question paper. Please try to practice many such question papers. This question paper is only supposed to give you an overview of the type of questions that can be asked in Written Tests. All the questions given are of Aptitude Test type.

Q1) A boy picks up the phone and asks, "Who are you?" The voice from the other side answers "I am your mother's mother in law". What is the relation of the boy with the fellow speaking at the other end?

Q2) Imagine a rectangle. Its length $=2 *$ width. A square of 1 inch is cut on all corners so that the remaining portion forms a box when folded. The volume of the box is 12 cubic inches. Find the original dimensions of the box.

Q3) 2 persons are doing part time job in a company (say ' $A$ ' and ' $B$ '). The company is open for all the 7 days of the week. ' $A$ ' works every second day. ' $B$ ' works every 3 rd day. If ' $A$ ' works on 1 st June and ' $B$ ' works on 2 nd June. Find out the date on which both ' $A$ ' and ' $B$ ' will work together.

Q4) Consider a pile of Diamonds on a table. A thief enters and steals $1 / 2$ of the total quantity and then again 2 extra from the remaining. After some time a second thief enters and steals $1 / 2$ of the remaining +2 . Then 3rd thief enters and steals $1 / 2$ of the remaining +2 . Then 4 th thief enters and steals $1 / 2$ of the remaining +2 . When the 5 th one enters he finds only 1 diamond on the table. Find out the total number of diamonds originally on the table before the 1 st thief entered.

Q5) Imagine 4 persons $A, B, C$ and $D$. It is a strength determining game and below are some statements:
'A' found it hard, but could pull ' C ' and ' D ' to his side.
AC and BD pairs on opposite sides found themselves equally balanced.
When A and B exchanged their positions to form pairs AD and BC, BC pair could win and pull AD to their side.
Order the 4 persons in ascending order according to their strengths.

Q6) There are 5 positions-Clerk, Buyer, Cashier, Manager, Floorwalker. There are 5 personsMrs. Allen, Mrs. Clark, Twain, Ewing, Bernett.
Conditions:
Clerk and Cashier lunch time: 11.30.to12.30
Others lunch time: 12.30 to 1.30
Mrs. Allen and Bernett play during lunchtime.
Clerk and Cashier share Bachelor rooms.
Ewing and Twain are not in good terms with each other because one day when Twain returned early from lunch he saw Ewing already back and sitting from lunch and reported about him to the manager.
Find out which person holds which post.

Q7) There is a robbery and four persons ' $A$ ', ' $B$ ', ' $C$ ' and ' $D$ ' are suspected out of them, one is actual thief. Following are the sentences said by each one of them. Out of these only one man is true remaining are false.
'A' says, 'D' had done.
' B ' says, ' $A$ ' had done.
'C' says, "I didn't do."
'D' says, "I am not a thief. And B lied with his statement"
Q8) A vender sold two things at same cost, Rs. 12 each, with one item at $25 \%$ profit and other at $20 \%$ loss. By this transaction did he made profit or loss? And by how much?

Q9) Two friends A, B are running up hill and then to get down. Length of road is 440 yards. A on his return journey meet B going up at 20 yards from top. A has finished the race 0.5 minute earlier than $B$, then how much time $A$ had taken to complete the race?

Q10) Between two employs, say ' $A$ ' and ' $B$ ', conversation goes like this.
A: Your work experience is twice as mine.
B: Exactly.
A: But two years ago, you said that your work experience is thrice as mine.
B: Yes its also true.
What are their work experiences?
Q11) There are four persons A, B, C, D and for languages English, French, German and Italian. Conditions:
Only one language is spoken by more than two men.
A don't know English.
One person can speak either French or German but not both.
All men can not speak in a group (no common language).
A can mediate when $B$ and $C$ want to speak with each other.
Each man can speak two languages.
Find out who can speak what languages.

Q12) There are 3 women A, B and C, each having three jewels, named Diamond, Emerald and Ruby. There are 3 thieves D, E and F. Each thief had taken one jewel from each of the women. The following conditions apply to the situation.
One who had taken Diamond is the bachelor and most dangerous.
D's brother in law is E, who is less dangerous than the thief who had stolen emerald.
D didn't stole from B.

C had to face most dangerous thief.
Find out who had which jewel and who stole what?
Q13) There were three suspects for a robbery that happened in a bank, Tommy, Joy and Bruce. Each of them was saying that I haven't done anything and the other two has done it. Police found that Tommy was lying. Who is the thief?

Q14) There were five persons A, B, C, D and E. Out of which two persons have white hairs and three persons have black hairs.
Conditions
$A$ and $B$ have same color of their hairs.
A's hair are black if C's hair are not black.
B's hairs are black if D's hairs are white.
C and E also have same color of their hairs.
Find out hair colors of every one of them.
Q15) Three clocks where set to true time. First run with the exact time second slows one minute/day and third gains one minute/day. After how many days they will show true time?

Q16) $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{C}, \mathrm{D}, \mathrm{E}$ are some numbers. If $\mathrm{AB} * \mathrm{CD}=\mathrm{EEE}$ and $\mathrm{CD}-\mathrm{A}=\mathrm{CC}$.
Then what is $\mathrm{AB} * \mathrm{D}=$ ? in the same code?

Q17) There were some containers of quantity $1,3,4,5,6,12,15,22,24,38$ liters. Each was filled with some liquid except one. The liquids are milk, water and oil. Quantity of each was like this
water $=2 *$ milk
oil $=2 *$ water
Find out which container was empty and containers filled with milk and oil.
Q18) There were five hunters $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{C}, \mathrm{D}$ and E and five animals $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{C}, \mathrm{D}$ and E . Hunter having the same name with the animal didn't kill it. Each hunter has missed some animal.
A animal was hunt by the hunter whose name matches with animal hunt by hunter B .
C animal was hunt by the hunter whose name matches with animal hunt by hunter A .
E has hunt C and missed D .
Find out animals hunted by $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{C}, \mathrm{D}$ and E .

Q19) Five students A, B, C, D and E. When conversation started B, C were speaking English. When D join them they shifted to Spanish. A, E knows French. B, E knows Italian. Portuguese was known to there of them. Spanish was the most common language between them. One of them knows five languages. One of them knows four languages. One of them knows three languages. One of them knows two languages. One of them knows only one language. Find out who can speak which languages?
